Year 1	<p>What colours can you see all around us? The children will choose and mix their own colours to create quality art work that shows progression in skills.</p>	<p>How can we use nature in art? The children will learn different techniques using natural materials; model making, observational drawing and ephemeral land art before creating a multimedia collage.</p>	<p>What do you see when you look at your face in the mirror? The children will learn about portraits, and use of different materials and techniques when making their own.</p>
Year 2	<p>How do we see Africa? Painting, beadwork, sculpting, cutting and drawing are some of the many skills the children will develop after exploring the colours and patterns of the African landscape and native tribes.</p>	<p>Are landscapes empty and cityscapes full? The children will begin by learning about the bright colours and bold brushstrokes used by the Impressionists. They will make paintings, drawings, and mosaic art, inspired by the three artists.</p>	<p>What makes a sculpture super? The children will use a range of materials to create sculptures inspired by famous works of art.</p>
Year 3	<p>Do all journeys tell a story? They will create a piece of artwork, which reflects a journey they have been on using specific symbols, colours and styles.</p>	<p>Does all European art look the same? The children will learn about how to draw broken buildings, shape buildings and paint on the ceiling to create quality artwork that shows progression in skills.</p>	<p>Do plants and insects belong in art? The children will learn how to make careful observations, mix different tints, shades and tones of colour, and create the illusion of depth within a picture.</p>
Year 4	<p>Can dots be powerful? The children will learn how to create art in the style of pointillism. The children will explore how Seurat used colours in his artwork and how he created effects and shading.</p>	<p>Can art help us understand the Vikings? The children will learn how to create a piece of Viking animal artwork, sketch a Viking dragon head and draw a portrait of a Viking warrior.</p>	<p>Are patterns all around us? The children will create their own patterns in a variety of contexts using stencils and printing.</p>
Year 5	<p>Does Art move? The children will create their own independent piece of movement art, drawing on the work of artists studied and the work they have previously created.</p>	<p>Are all great stories written? The children will then sketch their own headdress designs, explore and use decorative techniques and apply their experience of materials and techniques to create a headdress.</p>	<p>Does Art belong in the streets? The children will find out all about the many varied forms of art in public spaces. They will build up a collection of sketches and improve their designs for pieces.</p>

Year 6	Could Art have been used as a weapon in WW1? The children will recreate one of Nash's artworks to show what the landscape might have looked like prior to the war.	Can art play tricks with your mind? The children will look at a variety of ways in which optical art can be created before using what they have learnt to create their own optical artwork.	Do objects have meanings? The children will have the chance to explore colour, composition, control, form and style as they study a variety of different still life paintings and create their own.
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
